Our focus then will be to alert you not only to the things others in the state are doing but also to make you aware that you are not alone in your confusion, frustration, etc. We want to demonstrate that help is nearby and as easy to get as dialing a phone number or driving a few miles to another institution where someone has tried some of the very things you are considering with regards to your BI program.

It is this personal interaction that FACRL wants to develop. We want to expand our knowledge base relative to what is happening in our own state. Too many times, good programs exist which are not "big" enough to merit special emphasis at conventions, etc. This program will be a real step in changing that direction. Don't miss it.

So, get involved in FACRL. Take advantage of the resources the Chapter makes available to you. "Forrest Gump" was a GREAT movie, but remember, it was fiction. The educational and professional needs of librarians in Florida are real. Help us to continue filling some of those needs. YOU and FACRL are the stuff of libraries in Florida.

Laurie S. Linsley, Catalog Librarian has been appointed to the editorial board of the *Journal of Academic Librarianship*.




Automation

NETWORKS AND ASSOCIATIONS

Central Florida Library Consortium (CFLC)

The CFLC Continuing Education committee recently surveyed professional and paraprofessional staff in member libraries regarding perceived continuing education needs. The hot topics--ranked from highest to lowest--are the Internet, CD-ROM 'atabase searching, FIRN, reference, grant-writing, ILL, government documents, public relations, preservation, book repair, and MARC. The CFLC has already scheduled workshops on the Internet, FIRN, and ILL over the next year.

The CFLC board has established a Legislative Committee to develop and implement a program of communication and to provide information to legislators and members concerning consortium activities and needs.

College Center for Library Automation (CCLA)

Library patrons at any one of Florida's 28 community colleges can now search the online catalog of the State Library for access to its large volume of government and historical documents. In turn, State Library patrons can check the holdings of any community college library.

Community college students accessing LION (Library Online), the State Library's online catalog, can locate State Library resources and borrow most of them through interlibrary loan. State Library users now have access to LINCC which provides information about the resources of the community college library system, with current holdings of 1.3 million titles and 2.3 million volumes.

Circulation implementation continues at a steady pace. As of mid-July, 18 institutions were at some stage in circulation activity. In addition to bibliographic and circulation systems, LINCC has an e-mail program, LINCC-Mail, which connects staff at community college libraries.

As of April 1994, all 28 community colleges in Florida were connected to LINCC. During April, the system recorded more than 400,000 online catalog searches, including 2,600 where the users chose to access LUIS, the State University System online catalog managed by the Florida Center for Library Automation.

Florida Center for Library Automation (FCLA)

On August 30-31, FCLA held its annual Joint Meeting which brought together SUS members of the Public Services Committee, the Technical Services Committee, and the Library Liaisons.

A review of enhancements added in the last year included: the ability to do complex keyword Boolean searches from the command line using proximity; (coming soon) limiting by date, language and format; the addition of new citation databases; the Florida Documents Index, compiled by FAU; and the introduction of a full-text database, Florida Statutes, on LUIS.

System enhancements proposed, discussed, and prioritized for the coming year include:

- Search and retrieval of Course Reserve lists in LUIS, by name of instructor, course number, and course title
- Download and print LUIS screens, including the ability to send citations to e-mail addresses
- Add keyword/Boolean search capability to the technical services module

Panhandle Library Access Network (PLAN)

PLAN members who ordered the Panhandle Union List of Serials (PULSE) on CD-ROM got more than just a union list. OCLC and Auto-Graphics provided a multipurpose resource sharing system called SharePAC. Searching on the CD-ROM includes numeric, title, subject, keyword, and Boolean search capability. This features makes the CD appropriate for patron use, if desired.

Southeast Florida Library Information Network (SEFLIN)

The SEFLIN Free-Net is up and running, with the number of users surpassing 1,000 and new information being added every day. SEFLIN solicited from its users suggestions for new groups, forums, bulletin boards, and data sources to be added to the manu system.

Tampa Bay Library Consortium (TBLC)

A variety of workshops will be sponsored by the Tampa Bay Library Consortium over the next several months. Unless otherwise indicated, all workshops are held at TBLC Headquarters located in Suite 124, 10002 Princess Palm Avenue in Tampa, Florida. To register for a TBLC workshop, call the TBLC Headquarters at (813) 622-8252. The deadline for registering for a workshop is one week prior to the date of the workshop. After telephoning TBLC Headquarters, participants should mail in the registration form along with a check or money order made payable to the Tampa Bay Library Consortium. The form should be sent in even if payment will not be made until the day of the workshop. For additional information, contact Joyce Welch at (813) 622-8252. A cost is associated with each workshop.

Samuel Lazerow Fellowship

Applications are now being accepted for The Samuel Lazerow Fellowship for Research in Acquisitions or Technical Services in an Academic or Research Library. This award fosters advances in acquisitions or technical services by providing fellowships to librarians for travel, or writing in those fields. Research projects in collection development or the compilation of bibliographies are not supported by this fellowship. The award is \$1,000 cash and a citation donated by the Institute for Scientific Information.

Proposals are judged with an emphasis on the following: 1) potential significance of the project to acquisitions or technical services work; 2) originality and creativity; 3) clarity and completeness of the proposal; and 4) evidence of an interest in scholarship (previous publication record).

Brief proposals (five pages or less, double-spaced) should include the following: 1) description of research, travel or writing project; 2) schedule for project; 3) estimate of expenses (e.g., travel, faxes, data analysis, computer time, photocopying, typing); and 4) an up-to-date curriculum vitae.

Recipients of the fellowship are required to submit a report of the results of their research to ACRL for possible publication in C&RL News.

Eight copies of the application should be sent to the Samuel Lazerow Fellowship, Association of College and Research Libraries (ACRL), American Library Association, 50 East Huron Street, Chicago, IL 60611. The deadline for receipt of applications is December 1, 1994.


Thanks to each of you for providing news and information. A special thanks is owed to the UWF circulation staff for allowing me some time to edit while we are down a position and planning a move.
