The ADVANCE library system from Geac was installed at the Saint Leo College Library in the summer of 1995 with modules for public access, circulation, cataloging, acquisitions, and serials control. In January **Susan Ryan** and **Kelly Kannon**, Stetson University Academic Computing Services, conducted a full-day workshop on designing and creating departmental home pages.

Buildings

Rogers, Lovelock, & Fritz, a Winter Park, FL architectural firm, is working with Stetson University on several building projects, including a renovation and expansion of the duPont-Ball Library. During the summer of 1996, the main floor of the building will be under reno-

vation to provide for new automation workstations, lounge seating, new security system, displays of new books, periodicals, and videos, a new reference service desk; as well as other improvements.

Construction of a north wing, approximately 13,800 SF, will begin in May 1997, followed by an extensive renovation of the existing 48,000 SF facility. The overall project completion date is November 1998, after which some redeployment of collections and services is planned.

#### Automation

The Library has signed a contract for the Unicorn system from SIRSI to implement an automation system which will replace a CD-ROM catalog and several locally developed programs. The new system will include the OPAC, circulation, cataloging, serials, and acquisitions modules. Barcoding the collection will be a major component of the project. A graphical user interface will be specified for the OPAC, with full graphics functionality for Internet users accessing the system with a Web browser. Connections to a new CD-ROM LAN and links to periodical citation and full-text databases are planned as system features.

Baron de Montlezun's *Voyage Fait dans les Annees 1816 et 1817, de New Yorck a la Nouvelle-Orleans, et de L'Orenoque au Mississippi ...*, published in Paris, 1818.

a complete collection of the seven illustrated pamphlets published by the Florida East Coast Hotel. Each volume contains several photographs and descriptions of East Coast hotels.

33 reels of microfilm of the Cuban Exile newspaper, *Patria*. With support from an NEH grant, the University of Florida borrowed and microfilmed the original issues of *Patria*, from 1960-May 1995. The University of Miami Library was the primary source for this fragile and deteriorating newspaper.

the 1980 edition of the novel *Flatland: A Romance of Many Dimensions*, by Edwin A. Abbott. This copy, number 114 of an edition of 275, includes illustrations by Andrew Hoyem and a signed introduction by Ray Bradbury. The work consists of accordion panels, printed on both sides, with aluminum boards.

*Die Nywe Testament van ons Heer Heus Christus/Ka Set Over in Die Creols Tael en ka Giev na Die Ligt Tot Dienst van Die Deen Mission in America*, the second edition of the first translation of a Creole Bible from the West Indies, published in Copenhagen in 1818.

a poem by Sandra Dutton, "Grinspoon," Swamp Press, Amherst, Mass., 1983. This is number 38 of 100 copies printed on Japanese paper, rolled into a large scroll, and encased in a Lucite container.

*Pan Am Pioneer: A Manager's Memoir From Seaplane Clippers to Jumbo Jets*, by Sanford B. Kaufman, edited by George Hopkins. Published by Texas Tech Univer-

sity Press, 1995, this volume credits resources found in University of Miami's Pan Am Collection, including the cover illustration.

Jean Pierre Berenger's *Raccolta di Tutti Viaggi Fatti Intorno al Mondo ...* (1794-1796) and Martin Sauer's *Viaggio Fatto per Ordine dell'Imperatrice di Russia Caterina II...* (1816).

*The Lure of Miami*, by Bertha H. Blake, adding a virtually unknown publication to the holdings. This ephemeral title, published in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, by the Torch Press in 1923, includes a collection of poems about the city of Miami.

a 1970 two-volume edition of *Robinson Crusoe*, which includes the first appearance of Chalmer's *Life of DeFoe* and the addendum *A List of the Writings Which are Considered Undoubtedly DeFoe's*.

The University of Miami has acquired a group of letters by Franklin Q. Brown, former president of the Florida Southern Railroad and colonel of the Florida State Militia during the Spanish-American War. The letters provide insights to U.S. military activities in Tampa and Cuba.

The University of Miami has also acquired the papers of Paul Levine and Daniel Orrin Graham. Daniel Graham's professional career included service as a military officer and political strategist. The Graham Papers, donated by his family, include correspondence with military and political leaders relating to American defense policies during the 1970s and 1980s. The Library has also acquired the professional papers of Paul Levine, a graduate of the University of Miami Law School and acclaimed Florida crime writer. Paul is the author of the series of books whose main character, Jake Lassiter, is a former professional football player turned lawyer. The Levine Papers include drafts of such works as *False Dawn*, *Night Vision*, *To Speak For The Dead*, and *Slashback*. In addition, the Levine Papers include corre-

spondence with publisher, editors, and writing colleagues.

The Archives and Special Collections World Wide Web (WWW) pages continue to increase in number. Among the current pages available through the Internet are *Robinson Crusoe*, the library's two millionth volume; the *Pan American World Airways Inc. Records*; the *Treasures of Florida*.

The NBC-TV program "Dateline," a news magazine show, aired the first of a two-part story entitled "Heroine Scorned," on Wednesday, December 6.
