## **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

Hello FACRL members!

I am so excited to be writing this message as the new President of FACRL. What an honor! My term of office has been an incredibly busy one so far. We have so much to look forward to this year with our annual fall workshop and our spring program at the annual conference of FLA in Tampa. The spring program will be especially exciting as it is the first FACRL program of the new millennium. Wow!

As I hope all of you know by now, the fall workshop will be at the Hilton Daytona Beach on October 15<sup>th</sup>. I have visited the hotel and it is a wonderful facility. We will be meeting in a comfortable, large meeting room and our luncheon will be served in a rooftop dining room with a 180 degree view of the ocean. I was very impressed. The hotel has reserved rooms for FACRL at the rate of \$78 per night, double or single occupancy. Reserve early to receive this rate. Some of you may be wondering why we are not going back to Cocoa Beach this year. Our original plan was to return there for the workshop, but the space shuttle launch schedule interfered with our plans. While meeting space was available, hotel room space was not. On the recommendation of Marjorie Stealy at FLA, we talked with the Hilton and were able to book this hotel.

The workshop, entitled "Remote Impact: Distance Education in M.L.S. Programs" is going to be a day filled with thought-provoking issues and lively discussion. The goal is to get all attendees thinking about how distance education is impacting the integrity of the library profession. Is it a positive or negative influence? What are the logistical challenges of training professional librarians remotely? How well-prepared do recent graduates perceive themselves as they enter the profession? With the help of some outstanding panelists, the workshop should be illuminating and stimulating. Dr. Leigh Estabrook, Dean of the Graduate School of Library and Information Science at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, will be our keynote speaker. UIUC's distance program, LEEP3, is one of the leading programs in the country. The panel includes library educators from both of Florida's library schools: Dr. Kathy Burnett, FSU; Robert

Brooks, FSU; Dr. Vicki Gregory, USF; Joyce Kincannon, FSU; Elaine Yontz, USF. Dr. Kathleen de la Pena McCook was originally scheduled for the panel, but had to cancel due to a previous commitment with the National Endowment for the Humanities. Many thanks to Elaine Yontz for agreeing to serve in her place on the panel.

I hope all of you will join us for the workshop in Daytona Beach. I can assure you that Hurricane Floyd did minimal damage to the area, and we can expect wonderful accommodations. Be sure to return your workshop registration to Elaine Henjum by October 8<sup>th</sup>.
